Postgraduate applications



What is postgraduate study?

Postgraduate study usually refers to awards such as Graduate Certificates, Graduate Diplomas, Masters degrees and doctoral studies. It can also refer to graduate entry into Bachelor degrees. A postgraduate student is someone who has completed a university degree or diploma and is studying for a higher-level qualification.

When to apply

Applications open in early August before the year of admission. Closing dates are course specific. You can find information about the relevant closing date for each course using course search on the SATAC website.

How to apply

All applicants must apply online at satac.edu.au. The SATAC website provides a range of information about the SATAC application process. Before you get started, you should be familiar with the requirements of applying, as they affect your chances of getting an offer. They include:

- key dates and deadlines for applications
- SATAC fees and charges
- selection criteria for courses
- supporting documents (if required) for your qualifications

Choosing courses

One of the benefits of applying through SATAC is applying for more than one course at the same time.

In a single postgraduate application you can apply for up to six courses, offered by four institutions, starting at different times of the year. You only need to fill in one application form and supply supporting information once.

Offers

SATAC makes postgraduate offers on behalf of our participating institutions. Postgraduate offer rounds run regularly throughout the year (usually weekly!). Offer round dates are published on the SATAC website.
